City of Oshkosh Parking Changes

(Oshkosh, WI.) The city of Oshkosh would like to notify residents about parking changes in the city. Over the next several days, Oshkosh's familiar parking meters will gradually disappear from city streets and public parking lots. The fact that the meters are gone does not mean that parking is free. Instead, the city has developed a system which mixes permits, leased spaces, and free parking to meet the needs of downtown businesses, employees, customers, and residents. Spaces will be designated by color-coded signage, which will make it easier to see the parking spaces that are appropriate for an individual's needs. The implementation of the new parking program will begin October 1, 2009 and will be phased in over the next three to four weeks. Examples of the signs and explanations for usage are listed below.



Green-lettered signage will designate short-term, free parking spaces. These spaces are generally available for 90 minutes or less and are intended for customers or visitors. If you are an employee or property owner, please keep these spaces available as a courtesy to customers. Most of these spaces do not allow parking between 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.



Blue-lettered signage will designate permit parking. To use one of these spaces, you will need to have a daily permit, a monthly sticker, or an annual sticker. Monthly and annual stickers are available from the Collections office at City Hall. Daily permits are also available at the Collections office as well as participating businesses. Most of these spaces allow overnight parking, typically until 7:00 a.m.



Black-lettered signage will designate leased parking. These are reserved by specific individuals or businesses for a fee. Please contact the Collections office at City Hall for information on rates and availability of leased parking spaces. Some leased parking spots may be used for overnight parking until 7:00 a.m.

The guidelines and pictures shown are representative of typical conditions. Please consult signage (in and entering lots) for the precise parking requirements.
