Public feedback sought on Tribal Heritage Trail Connector

OSHKOSH, Wis., January 18, 2020 – The city of Oshkosh, in cooperation with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation through a federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant, is proposing to construct a 14 ft. wide asphalt multi-modal trail from Punhoqua Street through Rainbow Memorial Park, along the shoreline of the Fox River, for approximately .79 miles, and connect with the Oshkosh Avenue/WIS 21 intersection.

Construction of this 14 ft. wide asphalt trail will connect with the newly constructed Lakeshore Riverwalk trail to the west, creating a looped local trail system that will connect the Tribal Heritage Crossing and the WIOUWASH State Trail.
